## FIRST KNOWN STALLARDS OF AMERICA, FIRST AND SECOND GENERATION

Walter Stallard came from England and settled in old Rappahannock Co. and married Winifred Hodges, daughter of Wm. and Phoebe Smith Hodges, and Phoebe was daughter of Tobias and Phoebe Fauntleroy. His will was written 12-28-1683, probated October 1684 in Essex Co. Va. Their children were: Samuel born in Essex Co., St. Ann's Parish married 1st Sara Nicols and 2nd Grace ———. His will written 12-2-1720 probated 1725, Essex Co. which mentions son, Walter and daughter Sara, and wife Grace. In Essex Co. Samuel Stallard witnessed will of David Jamieson 12-2-1711, and also witness to Thomas Short's land sale 7-8-1713. Samuel Stallard sold in St. Ann's Parish 60 acres of land for 1600 lbs. of tobacco 3-20-1713/14. Samuel Stallard and George Berry executors of John Boulware's estate 8-14-1714. Samuel Stallard paid Quit Rent on 100 acres of land in Essex Co. Va. 1704. The will of Walter Stallard mentions Sara as receiving legacy from him in 1683.

## THIRD GENERATION IN AMERICA

III-1—Children of Samuel Stallard and Sara Nicols or Grace. II-1-2, No. 4—Walter born Essex Co. after 1692, probably married 1st to Elizabeth Williams there. IV-1—(This is same locality as in old Rappahannock Co. where his father originally lived). However, I am not certain which wife was mother of which children. Walter married 2nd about 1740 Hannah Pitts. He moved to Culpeper Co., no date, lived St. Marks Parish. IV-2—Will dated July 13, 1803, probated Apr. 20, 1807, Will Book E p. 124; executor, son Randolph; five shillings to son, Samuel; daughters, Peggy Eloise and Rachel Luttrell; wife Hannah; son David; son Walter; daughters, Eliza Cavendar, Mary Ann Scott and Fanny Shumate. Culpeper tax roll 1782 he owned slaves, Sam, Tanner, Bob, Tenney, Jacob, Frederick. Deed Book F p. 124 Culpeper Co. Grantor: Walter Stallard, Parish of St. Marks gives to son Samuel Stallard of Culpeper Co., tract of 200 acres in Culpeper Co. being part of tract granted Wm. Tapp by Thomas Lord Halifax deed dated Oct. 15, 1762, Wm. Tapp and heirs sold unto Walter Stallard 1770 recorded Aug. 20, 1770 (IV-2.) No. 5—Sara Elizabeth left property in father's will, Dec. 2, 1720. No record.

## FOURTH GENERATION IN AMERICA

IV-1—Children of Walter Stallard and Elizabeth Williams: III-1-4-No. 6—Samuel born St. Marks Parish, Culpeper Co., Va. about 1745; he married Jael Duncan there about 1770; she born there about 1750, she had red hair. The Duncan records are being written by others. In Culpeper Co. land records, Book K p. 19, Oct. 18, 1779, Samuel Stallard and Jael, his wife, of Culpeper Co., sell to Gavin Lawson of Culpeper Co. 200 acres granted him by his father Walter Stallard (deceased? or deed?) by gift on Aug. 20, 1770, etc., dated Oct. 18, 1779. Dr. Lee R. Dingus stated that Samuel

and Jael went to present Scott County in 1779, at that time being a part of old Washington Co., and Russell Co. in 1786 was formed out of the part of Washington Co. where Samuel settled near Osborn's Ford; in 1814 Scott Co. was formed out of this part of Russell Co. The Samuel Stallard farm there was owned in 1930 by William B. Gray whose grandfather William Gray first acquired it. Virginia tax rolls 1782, Samuel of Washington Co. owned 1 slave. Jael Duncan was a daughter of Rawley Duncan and Mary ———. V-1-No. 7—Elizabeth (Eliza) born there, married Mr. Cavender, called Eliza in father's will.

Note: It is said that late Rev. A. J. Wolfe found will of Samuel in Scott Co., dated 1816; his 1st wife died between 1806-1816 as the will gives different name to wife, thought to have been a Miss Nicols, no children. Please send in copy of will, someone. Although Hugh M. Addington gives Walker as one of children of Samuel and Jael, it is barely possible he may have been a child of Samuel's last marriage to a Miss Walker, and have died young. This must be carefully investigated.

IV-2—Children of Walter Stallard and Hannah Pitts: III-4-No. 8—Lieutenant Randolph, son of Walter and Hannah, according to History of Pioneer Families of Missouri; Bryan & Rose, 1876; p. 185; Pension Roll, Revolutionary service, born 1758 in Culpeper Co., married Mary Bullitt, Culpeper Co. DAR Lineage Bk. vol. 1091258; vol. 119-98. In 1782 tax rolls, Sulpeper Co. owned slaves Alice and Nancy. As a Revolutionary pensioner, lived with his son Randolph, jr. V-2-No. 9—Fanny born Culpeper Co., married 1st Taliaferro Scott, he died before July 13, 1803. She married 2nd Mr. Shumate, mentioned her father's will. No. 10—Mary Ann, married James Scott. No. 11—Rev. Walter, junior, born there 1750, Baptist minister; he married 1st Miss McClarah. No record of her death. V-3—Walter went to Kentucky 1783, to Bardstown, then to Spencer Co. where his first wife died. He returned to Virginia with three sons and two daughters where he married 2nd to Miss Bayse in 1785. V-4—Dr. Lee R. Dingus wrote that in Jefferson Co., Ky. is record that Walter was witness on land certificate of Floyd to Wells, June 20, 1785. In 1782 Virginia tax rolls, Fauquier Co., he owned 1 slave. After his return to Kentucky he had four sons. 1790 U. S. Census, Nelson Co., Ky., Nov. 1, he was a taxpayer.

No. 12—Margaret Eloise (Peggy) born there, married Mr. Clore.

No. 13—Rachel born there married Richard Luttrell. V-5. No. 14—David born there 1748 married a Miss Pitts. V-6. No. 15—John born there, mortally wounded serving American Revolution, not mentioned in father's will, probably younger than Lieut. Randolph. No record. V-1. Children of Samuel Stallard and Jael Duncan. I-V-1-6; data from Family Bible of Dr. Samuel Carter Stallard; Mrs. Carrie Burkett;

## EDITORIAL

This bulletin on the Stallard genealogy is the beginning of a series of bulletins to be printed quarterly by the editor and assistant editor, and they wish you to forward all Stallard genealogical material to them. A year's subscription is only one dollar and will be greatly appreciated to help to carry on the work. Mr. Hamilton and Mrs. Humphreys have spent years in collecting the Stallard material and now some of their finding and family records will be printed for the first time.

The source of some of this material comes from: H. B. Guppy's "The Homes of Family Names" which places the Stallards in Somersetshire, England, and the Duncans in Scotland. Beardsley's "Dictionary of English and Welsh Names" says Stallard was a baptismal name of the same origin as Stannard or Stonard, but there is no trace of Stallard on the "Hundred Rolls" of England; Arthur Stallard of England had the idea that the name Stallard may have come from the Normans and St. Allard became Stallard; various family records of the Culpeper, Scott and Washington Counties, Kentucky, Indiana, Missouri and California records will be also given of the Stallards, found in the Kilgore, Addington, Dingus, Hutchinson, Moore, Carter, McConnel, Beswick, Pittman, and many other allied families.

No. 16—Rawley born Culpeper Co., Va. Jan. 30, 1771, married Elizabeth Hutchinson in Scott Co. Va., she born in then Russell Co.; Rawley died Scott Co. Nov. 20, 1856 age 85 yrs., 9 mos. 26 days; Elizabeth died there. Her parents were Peter Hutchinson and Nancy Green. VI-1. No. 17—Frances (Franky) born there married James Watson in present Scott Co. No. 18—Ruth born there married in present Scott Co. 1st to Mr. Fletcher, and she married 2nd there to William Kitchin and moved to Indiana. No. 19—Walter, junior, born there about 1775, married 1st Elizabeth Carter, a daughter of Norris Carter, in present Scott Co., a son was probably Dr. Samuel Carter Stallard. VI-2.

Walter married 2nd in present Scott Co. to Miss Bevins, she born there 1780, she died there Jan. 10, 1836. Walter died Scott Co. Apr. 28, 1834. (Hugh M. Addington does not give Walter's place.) No. 20—Mary (Polly) born Scott Co. married Edley Murphy. VI-2. No. 21—Dulcinea (Cene) born there 1781 married James Green, jr. James born in Washington Co. probably Porter's Fort 1783; Cene died 1842. James son of James Green sr. and Jean Porter; Jean Porter daughter of Patrick Porter and Agnes Glasgow; Agnes Glasgow sister of wives of Capt. John Snoddy and Capt. John

Cowan. Dr. Lee R. Dingus stated James Green, sr. came from east Virginia and founded Scott Co. at Fort Blackmore 1772; 1783 killed by Chief Benge in Wise Co. on Indian Creek while hunting; married Jean Porter, daughter of Capt. Patrick Porter, 1782, had son James junior born 1783, who married Senna Stallard, daughter of Samuel and Jael (Duncan); James Green's widow married 2nd Rev. Robin Kilgore, who built the old Kilgore Fort on Copper Creek in 1787. VI-4. No. 22—Rev. James W., born present Scott Co. about 1782, married there 1st to Sarah Whittenburg, of German ancestry, she died either Scott Co. Va. or in Lincoln Co. Tenn. VI-5. James W. married 2nd probably Lincoln Co. Tenn. to Sarah W. McClure. VI-6. James W. was local Methodist minister, "exhorter"; he bought 70 acres in Lincoln Co. Tenn 1814 and sold it 1817, moved to Indiana. U. S. Census 1820 Fayette Co., Connersville Township, Indiana vol. 6, p. 18 gives 4 males under 10, 3 males 10 to 16, 1 male 26 to 45, 1 female 26 to 45; 2 males engaged in agriculture. Rush Co. Indiana Census 1830 vol. 13 p. 530 gives 1 male under 5, 1 male 40 to 50, 3 females 5 to 10, 1 female 40 to 50. He bought land at Brookville Land Office, in Anderson Township, Rush Co., Oct. 27, 1820. He was alive 1830 when officiated at marriage Dec. 18, 1830 in Rush Co. He bought and sold several parcels of land in both Orange and Anderson townships in Rush Co. Indiana, the last entry being Nov. 24, 1840, land in Anderson Township.

No. 23—Sarah born Scott Co. Va. 1790, married William Addington, junior, he born 1790, son of William Addington, born London, England, who came to America age twenty, served as Quartermaster with army of Gen. Geo. Washington, was present with his oldest child, Charles Cromwell age about five, at Surrender at Yorktown. William, senior, settler 1785 in what is now Russell Co. Va. He married Margaret Cromwell, daughter of an uncle of Oliver Cromwell. VI-7. No. 24—Walker born Culpeper Co. Va. probably one of oldest children, although may have been child of father's 2nd marriage late in life. Page 88 of History of Family of Addington, by Hugh M. Addington, pub. 1931, gives Walker as child of Sumuel and Jael. It has been suggested also that Walker may have been maiden name of Mary Duncan's mother, she was mother of Jael Duncan who married Rawley Duncan. V-2. Children of Lieut. Randolph Stallard and Mary Bullitt. IV-2-8. No. 25.—Susanna born Culpeper Co. Va. married Jan. 17, 1797 Frederick Duncan, his parents probably William Duncan, jr. and Rosanna Norman, and he was a son of William Duncan, sr. and Ruth Rawley. No. 26—Maria L. married John McCormick. No. 27—Lucy married William McCormick. No. 28—Thomas married Betsy Luttrell, a cousin. No. 29—Joseph B. married Haniah Johnson, settled in St. Charles Co., Missouri in 1836. He was soldier War 1812, probably Virginia, VI-9. No. 30—Randolph, jr. married Mary Redd; his father lived with him while a pensioner of the Revolution; will book P p. 44 of 1843, and will of Mary M. Stallard, will Bk. X p. 514 of 1882. VI-10. V-3. Children of Rev. Walter Stallard, jr. and Miss McClanahan. IV-2-11. No. 31—McClanahan born Kentucky, married probably ancestor of Pitts Stallard, of High Grove, Kentucky. No. 31—Hannah probably born Kentucky, married. No. 33—Polly (Mary) probably born Kentucky, married. V. 4. Children Rev. Walter Stallard, jr. and Miss Bayse. IV-2-11. Data in letter Pitts Stallard to Rawley Stallard, grandfather of Mrs. Humphreys; does not mention daughters by Miss Bayse. No. 34—Fannie probably born Kentucky, married, no record. No.

35—Elizabeth probably born Kentucky, married, no record. No. 36—James probably born Kentucky, died 1838, no record. No. 37—Edmund probably born Kentucky, died there 1914, married there. VI-11. No. 38—David, married Joanna Tutts May 5, 1842, died of cholera in 1853, had sons Pitts, Benj. and David. VI-12. No. 39—Pitts, married, died 1838, had son Lamuel. V-5. Children of Rachel Stallard and Richard Luttrell. IV-2-13. Vo. Mag. Hist. 1926, vol. 34 p. 80; Dr. Harvey Stallard. No. 40—Sarah Luttrell born Dec. 23, 1807, married Albert Gallatin Stallard, a cousin, January 15, 1838 (No. 28, 1833); lived at Rixeyville, Culpeper Co. Va.; she died Feb. 3, 1893. (Must have married 1833 as oldest child born 1837). VI-12. See V-6, No. 55. 41—Joseph, married, no record. No. 42—Nancy married Dr. Sidney Davis. No. 43—Agnes married Burkett Wilkins. No. 44—Hannah married James Luttrell. No. 46—Walter married, moved to Indiana. No. 47—William married Rebecca Amiss, moved to Indiana. No. 48—Malinda married Abraham Grandstaff.

V-6. Children of David Stallard and Miss Pitts. IV-2-14. Mrs. Wine, Culpeper Co. Va. to Mrs. Humphreys; Allied Families of Read, Corbin, Luttrell and Bywaters-Pritchard; pages 201, 204, etc. No. 49—Joseph Pitt, no record. No. 50—Nancy Sale married Dr. Sidney Davis (is this same as No. 42 above?). No. 51—Agnes Andrews married Robert W. Silvey Dec. 22, 1829. No. 52—Haniah Williams married Burkett Elkins. No. 53—Elizabeth married 1st William Monroe, married 2nd James Luttrell, cousin. No. 54—Walter Henry, married in Indiana. No. 55—Albert Gallatin married cousin, Sarah Luttrell in 1833. See VI-13. No. 56—William married 1st Rebecca Amiss, 2nd in Indiana. No. 57—Malinda Gray married Abraham Grandstaff. Query. There appears to be much confusion in the above families. Please correct this, someone.

Stallard; Family Bible of Raleigh Sherman Stallard; photostat of letter from Rawley to his son Samuel Duncan Stallard dated May 1, 1820, and letter of Hugh M. Addington to Arthur Hamilton in 1943. No. 58—Samuel Duncan born Scott Co. Va. July 13, 1793, died Feb. 22, 1872 at Poca-hontas, 10 miles west of Greenville, Illinois at his home; married Elizabeth Williams, of Quaker parents (her mother was Mary Ann Embree) Dec. 23, 1824 in Bond Co. Illinois. She born Nov. 27, 1806 and died in 1873; went to Illinois from Virginia 1818. VII-1. No. 59—Frances born March 9, 1795, married Thomas Moore July 12, 1816, she died Jan. 7, 1888, buried Moore Cemetery in Scott Co.; married by Rev. Ivey Walker at Gate City Va. VII-2. No. 60—Peter born May 18, 1797, married Margaret Addington Dec. 19, 1823, first recorded Addington marriage in Scott Co. Va.; she born in then Russell Co. Va. Feb. 29, 1797, daughter of William Addington, sr. and Margaret Cromwell. Peter died March 22, 1880, Margaret died Aug. 15, 1882. VII-3. Margaret's brother, William Addington, jr. married Sarah Stallard, sister of Rawley; sister Elizabeth Addington married Duncan Stallard; brother Rev. Jackson Addington married Verlina Hutchinson. No. 61—John born 1799 married Nancy Newberry. VII-4. No. 62—James born 1800 married Elizazeth Fisher McConnell in Scott Co. Va. Aug. 27, 1825, daughter of Sheriff George McConnell and Susan Snavely of Scott Co. Va. VIII-5. No. 63—Jaela born present Scott Co. Va. 1801, married Jacob

Wolfe. VIII-6. No. 64—Raleigh Duncan born 1804, married Mary (Polly) Forrester VII-7. No. 65—Nancy born 1807, married William Gray. No. 66—Martha born 1809, married Samuel Courtner. No. 67—Elizabeth born there May 22, 1813, married Rev. William Addington in Scott Co. Va. Jan. 23, 1837, he born Va. May 6, 1812, son of Charles Cromwell Addington and Anna Doaty. VII-8. No. 68—Duncan Allen born 1814, married Elizabeth Addington in Scott Co., sister of Margaret, who married Peter Stallard. According to letter of Duncan Allen Stallard to Rawley Stallard March 31, 1892 and letter Dr. Frank Stallard, Hazelton, Kansas to Mrs. John Humphreys; letter Rawley Stallard to son Duncan Stallard May 15, 1829 in which Rawley said he had 40 grandchildren, 19 great-grandchildren, all "Methodist Protestants," at time of writing Rawley lived at Hutchinson P. O., Wise Co. Va. VII-9. No. 69—Green C. born 1817, married 1st Elizabeth Cox. Erza B. Cox, Bristol, Va. has this data. Green C. married 2nd Elizabeth Davis, Green C. died in 1907. No. 70—Priscilla born 1830, married Mr. Hillmann. VII-12. Children of Walter Stallard, jr. and Elizabeth Carter. V-1-19. No. 71—James married Elizabeth McConnell (not Elizabeth Fisher McConnell) and were ancestors of Dr. J. N. Hillman. No. 72—Dr. Samuel Carter who kept family record; Family Bible. VI-3. Children of Mary Stallard and Edley Murphy. V-1-20. No. 73—Robert. VI-4. Children of Cene Stallard and James Green, jr. V-1-21. No. 14—Robert Green married Marinda Thompson in Russell Co. Va., one of most noted school teachers in Scott Co., moved Kentucky close of Civil War, left issue around Sandy Hook. No. 75—James Green married Nancy Gardner, in Scott Co., moved to Kentucky. No. 76—William Green married Sally Hutchinson Oct. 15, 1837, moved to Kentucky. No. 77—Martin Green married Elizabeth Gillenwaters Sept. 5, 1852, moved to Kentucky. No. 78—Mary Ann (Polly) Green married William Dingus April 14, 1831, he son of Philip and Nancy (McConnell) Dingus, born Dauphin Co. Pa. 1775, came to Russell Co. Va. 1803, his brother-in-law George McConnell who married Susanna Snavely, came to Russell Co. at same time. VII-10. No. 79—Susan Green married Claiborne White 1st, 2nd Jeff Madon, moved to Kentucky. No. 80—Eliza Jane Green married John Armstrong Dec. 31, 1829, moved to Kentucky. No. 81—Jael Green married James Brickey March 18, 1840, lived at Fort Blackmore, Va. No. 82—Aledia Green married Mr. Sparks, moved to Kentucky.

VI-5. Children of Rev. James W. Stallard and Sarah Whittenburg. VI-22. Margaret R. Waters; Mrs. Carrie Burkett; Mrs. John Humphreys. No. 83—Rev. Joseph W. born July 10, 1806, probably Lincoln Co. Tennessee, died July 10, 1896, Russellville, Indiana; Methodist exhorter over sixty years; married 1st Eleanor Julian, January 29, 1824 by Rev. Jesse Hale, Methodist minister, license issued Jan. 26, 1824 bk. - p. 23, Rush Co.; she died before June 23, 1831. VII-11. He married 2nd Lorinda Selby June 23, 1831 by Gabriel C. McDuffie, Church of Christ minister, license issued June 13, 1831, by. 3 p. 100, Rush Co.; Indiana Census 1830 Rush Co. vol. 13 p. 534, head of family, 1 male 20 to 30. His son by 1st wife was enumerated in family of his father in Census 1830. He died 11 days after son by first wife, who died June 29, 1896, so Joseph W. must have died July 10, 1896. Bought Government land in Orange Township, Rush Co. Dec. 17, 1825; various real estate deals, last one March 10, 1838 in Moscow, Indiana. VII-12. No. 84—Samuel Stallard born 1807

probably Lincoln Co. Tenn. and married Sarah Crawford in Rush Co. Ind. June 23, 1831 by Jolen (?) Longley, elder in Christian Church, license issued June 18, 1831 Book 3 p. 100; he bought 76 acres from his father in Anderson Township, Rush Co. Ind. March 30, 1833; last real estate deal he sold 76 acres Jan. 23, 1851. Lived in Marshall Co. Indiana Jan. 26, 1871. No. 85—Abraham born 1809 probably Lincoln Co. Tenn., married Barbara Ann Rader in Rush Co. Ind. Sept. 30, 1830 by Abner Conde, Justice of Peace, license issued Sept. 9, 1830, book 5 p. 349; note\* there was a William Stallard married Catharine Ann Rader in Rush Co. Ind. March 6, 1851, license issued March 3, 1851, married by F. M. Hester, minister, book 7, p. 107—do not know relation. Abraham bought a lot in Moscow, Orange Township, Rush Co. Ind. July 27, 1830. No. 86—Rev. Isaac born 1811 probably Lincoln Co. Tenn., married Caroline Raynes in Rush Co. Ind. by Robert McDuffee, Methodist minister, May 18, 1837, license issued May 17, 1837 book 4 p. 324. He lived in Fulton Co. Ind. Jan. 19, 1871. Had various real estate deals in Rush Co. Indiana, last one, sold lot in Moscow, March 21, 1838. "Home Foiks, a Series of Stories by Old Settlers of Fulton Co. Indiana" vol. 1 p. 11 "among the settlers were several ministers or exhorters. I recall the name of Isaac Stallard . . ."

VI-6. Children of Rev. James W. Stallard and Sarah W. McClure. V-1-22. No. 87—Rev. Jacob McClure born Lincoln Co. Tenn. Sept. 11, 1813 died at Lafayette, Tippecanoe Co. Ind. July 30, 1893, S-10L.59. He bought Government land, total 160 acres, in Warren Co. Indiana July 14, 1846, Blotter 34650 and Blotter 34651, Crawfordsville Land Office. He married first to Maria L. (Stallards say middle name Lancaster, but on gravestone at Battleground, Tippecanoe Co., Ind. says "Louise") Beswick, in Boone Township, Harrison Co., Indiana July 25, 1837, Marriage Book 3 p. 74. She was born there March 10, 1816 and she died at Battleground (former Harrisonville) Tippecanoe Co. Indiana Aug. 15, 1850 and buried in Hamilton Plot of Tabernacle Graveyard there. Her parents were Philip Beswick, born Virginia Jan. 20, 1782, who died July 10, 1847, buried in graveyard on his farm in Boone Township, Harrison Co. Indiana; he married Sarah Pitman in Lincoln Co. Kentucky Apr. 25, 1807, her bondman was future brother-in-law James Price, and she died Nov. 10, 1851, buried at Moore's Hill, Dearborn Co. Indiana; she born in Lincoln Co. Kentucky Oct. 23, 1788. Her father was Captain Thomas Pitman, a Revolutionary veteran, Illinois Papers D No. 127, service on Northwest Frontier with General Clark, and Arthur Hamilton belongs to California Society Sons of Revolution No. 2240 through this service; Capt. Thomas Pitman married Rachel Berry of Warren Co. Kentucky in Lincoln Co. Kentucky on March 30, 1782. Will of Capt. Thomas Pitman written Sept. 13, 1826 probated December Court 1825 in Mercer Co. No heirs-at-law named in the will. Inventory, mostly farm tools, total \$280.75. James bought 60 acres March 29, 1841, this land for which quit-claim deeds were signed in 1871 by heirs-at-law, 8 quit-claim deeds each for \$150.00. Either the widow died in 1871, or remarried. James bought 30 acres in Orange Township, Rush Co. Ind. Aug. 5, 1845, sold small parcel of land Aug. 27, 1850 which was quit-claim deed for dower rights of Catharine, his wife, land she inherited from her father Enoch McDuffie; James sold 40 acres June 1, 1853. 90—Susan Peggy, no record in Rush Co. Indiana, the name from letter of Mrs. Carrie Burkett to Mrs. John Humphrey. No. 91—Jaala Rebecca, probably born 1821 according to obituary, Howard Co. Kentucky Apr. 4, 1821; his father was Joseph Hopkins, a talented lawyer; after his father's death his mother married a farmer, came with her husband and son to Rush Co. Indiana and lived on a farm. At age of fifteen Milton B. asked his step-father for an education and was refused; he left home. Worked in a livery stable, self-educated; taught in country schools; studied Greek and Latin privately; at age twenty he was a preacher in Milroy, Rush Co. Ind.; moved to Frankfort, Ind., six years later moved to Noblesville, Ind.; abandoned ministry and return to ministry, had a superior reputation as a preacher. took up law; reputation good as a lawyer; was persuaded to return to ministry, had a superior reputation as a preacher. After living about five years in Noblesville, united with Benjamin Franklin, an editor of Cincinnati, Ohio, is publishing "American Christian Review"; moved to Cincinnati, Ohio, preached there, also at Louisville and Covington, Kentucky; health failed. Ind., founded "Farmers Academy," while there was nominated by the Democrats for Superintendent of Public Instruction, State of Indiana, but he declined nomination. After four years there he moved to Boone Co. Ind. and took charge of Lebanon High School. Took charge of "Ladoga Academy," intending to convert it into a college. He taught there. Preached in various parts of Indiana for about six

years. Moved to Kokomo, Howard Co. Ind. as better facilities to establish college with his two oldest sons, who had finished their study in Kentucky University, founded "Howard College" as President 1870; nominated by Democrats as Superintendent of Public Instruction, and was elected. He was only nominal president of Howard College after that. 1872 re-elected Superintendent of Public Instruction of State of Indiana; abandoned Howard College. A few months before expiration of his second term of office he died Aug. 16, 1874 at Kokomo, Indian, age 53. He had five children. His wife died in Ohio Nov. 9, 1905—reported in Howard Co. Ind. Indiana in December 1846. His mother taught children to read and spell. "Home Folks — Series of Stories by Old Settlers of Fulton Co., Indiana; Vol. 1 p 134. He enlisted Oct. 1861 in 46th Indiana Volunteer Infantry Regiment, Company K, served almost four years; April 8, 1864 one of 80 prisoners at Battle of Mansfield Louisiana; to Camp Ford, near Tyler, Texas, no food for three days; Dec. 5, 1864 paroled, sent to Galveston, Texas; by steamer "Clifton" for New Orleans. Arrived home about six in evening Dec. 31, 1864. About Feb. 1, 1865 joined his regiment at Lexington, Ky. and mustered out Sept. 4, 1865 at Louisville, Ky. No. 1. Walter Stallard came to Virginia from England and settled in 1640 in that part of Old Rappahannock County which became Essex County by the time of his death. Report of Dr. J. N. Hillman.

No. 4. Walter Stallard and his second marriage to Hannah Pitts. "A History of the Pioneer Families of Missouri"—Wm. S. Bryan and Robert Rose; published St. Louis, Missouri 1876. Pages 160, 164, etc. "St. Charles County, Missouri: Walter Stallard and his wife, Hannah Pitts, were both of Virginia. Their son Randolph married Mary Bullett, of Culpepper County, Virginia, and they had seven children."

No. 8. Lieut. Randolph Stallard, record in D. A. R. Lineage Book 109, page 258; book 119, page 98.

No. 13. Rachel Stallard, no birth date, married before 1775 in Culpepper County, Virginia as his first wife, to Richard Luttrell, junior. Richard was born in 1735 in Culpepper County and died about 1821. Letter of Mrs. Willis A. Shuttuck, Box 332, Ashland, Kansas states this information is in her D. A. R. papers (letter June 26, 1950). "Allied Families of Read Corbin Luttrell Bywaters," by A. M. Pritchard, Staunton, Virginia, pub. 1930. Pages 197 and following: "The children of the original emigrant, Richard Luttrell, were named in his Will, written 10 Sept. 1764, probated 26 May 1766 in Fauquier County, Virginia; eleven children and No. 5 was Richard Luttrell, junior. Richard Luttrell, junior was a veteran of the American Revolution, Ensign in Fauquier County, Virginia, Militia 25 October 1780; his descendants accepted in D. A. R. etc. In Fauquier County records he recovered judgment 8-29-1760; Minute Book for 1759-60, page 98. His Will dated 4-24-1819 probated 5-21-1821 in Culpepper County, Virginia Will Book H page 301, mentions wife Rachel. His son, James Luttrell, prepared a family tree of Walter Stallard's descendants, stated that Walter Stallard's daughter Rachel married Richard Luttrell, Jr. (This family tree has been found to have errors). For children see V-5. In Vol. 1 No. 1 a whole generation was omitted, and V-5 on page 3 is incorrect. See corrections later.

### Page 2 corrections:

No. 25. Susanna Stallard born Culpepper County, Virginia 1780 married Frederick Duncan. For children see VI-8. Frederick Duncan was born 1770, a son of William Duncan and Rosanna Norman; grandson of William Duncan and Ruth Rawley; also grandson of Courtney Norman and Mary Brown.—According to Miss Nancy R. Roy, Box 3, Fellows, California, a descendant.

No. 28. Thomas Stallard married Betsy Luttrell. For children see VI-8-A. In "Allied Families of Read Corbin Luttrell Bywaters" by A. M. Pritchard page 197 and following: Report of Wm. D. Robson, there is no date or place given of birth, marriage or death. Elizabeth Luttrell was the third

child of Richard Luttrell, junior and his wife Rachael Stallard. See V-5 corrected version later on, Elizabeth Luttrell No. 257.

No. 29. Joseph B. Stallard married Hannah Johnson. "A History of the Pioneer Families of Missouri"—Bryan & Rose, 1876; pages 160, 184, 446. St. Charles County: John Johnson, of England, settled in Albemarle County, Virginia at a very early date. He had two sons, Bailey and James. Bailey married a Miss Moreland, and they had nine children: Beall, Susan W., Bailey, junior, John, Pinckard, Smith, George, Charles and Presley. Bailey and Charles were the only ones who left Virginia. George was a soldier in the Revolutionary War. He, George Johnson, married Elizabeth Blackmore, of Virginia, and they had nine children—Elizabeth, HANNAH, Catharine, Nancy, Charles, Edward, George, Bailey and Jemima. Nancy, Edward, Catharine and Jemima died in childhood in Virginia. Charles was married twice, first to Rachel Woodward and second to Harriet Ficklin, both of Virginia. By his first wife he had three children, and by the second, four. In 1836 he bought Nathan Boone's farm and settled in St. Charles Co., Missouri, but in 1846 he removed to Illinois. Elizabeth married Rodman Kenner, who settled in St. Charles County in 1834. HANNAH married JOSEPH B. STALLARD, who settled in St. Charles County in 1835. George S. married Mrs. Eliza A. Hunter, whose maiden name was Gautkins. She was a daughter of Edward Gautkins and Mary Oty, of Bedford County, Virginia. Bailey was married twice, first to Catherine Forshea, and after her death to Nancy Campbell. For children of Joseph B. Stallard, see VI-9.

No. 31. McClanahan Stallard. No. 32. Hannah Stallard, probably born Kentucky, married.

V-2. Children of Lieut. Randolph Stallard and Mary Bullitt; IV-1-No. 8. Add, NO. 254, HARRISON, died young or unmarried, evidently last child. "A History of the Pioneer Families of Missouri," Bryan & Rose, 1876. "Randolph Stallard married Mary BULLETT, of Culpepper Co., Virginia and they had SEVEN children. (Mrs. Maude Humphreys wrote April 30, 1950 that there was an EIGHTH child, NO. 255, BULLETT STALLARD, who married and went to Trenton, Illinois, to live and rear a family. She remembers some of his children. No data at present). Given in the History are: Susan, Maria, Lucy, Thomas, Joseph B., Randolph, junior, and HARRISON (now add BULLETT).

### Page 2 and 3 corrections:

V-4. Children of Rev. Walter Stallard, junior, and Miss Bayse. IV-2-No. 11. Data from Kentucky State Historical Society Quarterly 1922, Vol. 20, page 173: Kentucky Marriages in Nelson County; performed by W. Stallard Feb. 7, 1811—Edmund Stallard (No. 37) and Margaret Robinson, for children see VI-11; Edmund supposedly died in 1814. Performed by W. Stallard Feb. 11, 1813: David Stallard (No. 38) and Elizabeth Stone, for children see VI-12; this probably first marriage for David, as he also married Joanna Tutts 5-5-1842 and he died of cholera in 1853. Not known who was mother of Pitts, Benjamin and David junior.

No. 47. Harriet Quillin reared in, married in Scott County, Virginia.

VI-4. Children of Cene Stallard and James Green Junior, V-1-No. 21. Data from Mrs. Jane Culbertson who died age 91, daughter of Polly Ann Dingus who was daughter of James Green junior, according to letter of R. L. McConnell, April 24, 1950. Also data from McConnell Marriage Genealogy, by Hugh M. Addington; and C. V. Compton. According to R. L. McConnell, letter April 29, 1950, Robert Green, No. 74, and Marinda Thompson, his wife, lived on Stony Creek in Scott County, Va. No. 75, James Green, married Nancy Gardner of south of Clinch Mountain before they moved to Kentucky.

No. 78. Polly Ann Green married William Dingus and lived in Scott County, Virginia. The late Dr. Lee R. Dingus wrote that William Dingus was a son of Philip Dingus. Dr. Dingus stated that John Dingus married 1st Nancy Compton and married 2nd Jael Powers who was born Jael Stallard. He said that John Dingus and Nancy Compton had 1. Aaron who married Miss Smith; 2. Crocket who married Ellen Davis; 3. William married Lucy Stallard. Dr. Dingus stated that John Dingus and Jael (Stallard) Powers had 1. Nancy who married William C. Daugherty; Lucy who married Elbert Meade; George who married Miss Carico.

Dr. Dingus wrote: "There were apparently several branches of the Dingus family who were early widely scattered in Pennsylvania and Virginia, even several spellings as well as pronunciations originally or that have developed and become fixed in later generations in different areas of the country. Dinges, Dingess, Dingas, Dings, Dingus, Din-ius; the pronunciations being Ding-es, Din-jes, Ging-ges (or -gus), Din-i-us. However, all representatives of these varied spellings and pronunciations with whom I have been able to get in contact, seem to agree on a pretty definite and uniform background of origin. That the family is of Germanic stock reaching American shores in the middle and third quarter of the eighteenth century at the port of Philadelphia and coming from the Palatinate region of the middle German Valley by way of Amsterdam or Rotterdam in Dutch vessels.

"They settled around Lancaster Co. Pennsylvania and west of there, where some are reported to be living at the present time. Individuals and families of the name during and after the American Revolution came into the Valley of Virginia, moving westward into southwestern Virginia and then one branch northward into what is now Logan County, West Virginia. The Valley branch (Rockingham, Shenandoah, Frederick Counties) usually spell the name Ding-es, but it is sometimes pronounced Din-jes. The branch going out of Montgomery County (eastern edge of southwestern Virginia into Logan County, now West Virginia) usually spell the name Dingess two "ss"). The branch moving into Russell, Scott and Lee Counties (extreme southwestern part

of the state) now uniformly spell the name Dingus, but both cling to the old German pronunciation Ding-es. It is to this last name I belong.

"My earliest ancestor in this area was Phillip (two "ll's) in the county records of Russell County, Scott County and the Land Office Archives, Richmond, Virginia and has the spelling Dinges, Dingus. It occurs sometimes as Dingis and again as Dingas. This variance could happen from ignorance or carelessness of the recorder or copyist, indifference of the man himself. However, he seems to have been illiterate as I have in my possession authentic books of his printed in America, but in the German language.

"The West Virginia Dinges branch served in the Revolution armies, one was in Gen. Washington's army at the surrender of Gen. Cornwallis and his descendants have been taken into patriotic organizations like the S. A. R. and D. A. R.

"In about 1799 according to all indications and traditions this Phillip Dingus married Nancy McConnell, a younger sister of George McConnell, probably in Dauphin Co., Penn. All early Russell Co. Va. marriage records of the period were lost by fire in 1886. Numerous descendants of these two families are yet to be found in Scott and adjoining counties. One son of Phillip Dingus, Henry and his family about 1835 moved to eastern Kansas, where, and in western Missouri, his descendants live. Others of the Scott family are found in several counties of eastern Kentucky, in eastern Tennessee, in Texas and on the Pacific coast."

No. 79. Susan Green married 2nd Jeff Mason and moved to Kentucky. No. 81. Jaley Green married James Brickley, lived and died on Stony Creek, in Scott County, Virginia.

No. 82. Almedia Green.

No. 86. Rev. Isaac Stallard, children VII-13.

Calvin was a son of Jesse Blankenbeckler, and was born Nov. 5, 1822 in Rye Valley in that part of Wythe County, Virginia now known as Smyth County, Virginia. Calvin married March 10, 1840 Edith Evans, who was ten years his senior, and was a daughter of Greenberry and Nancy (Lily) Evans. Edith Evans was born April 17, 1812 at Little Mocassin Gap in Washington County, Virginia. Calvin died January 14, 1887 and Edith died September 12, 1887, both buried Nickelsville Cemetery. Court records seem to show that the father of Calvin was Jesse Blankenbeckler the fourth son of Zachariah, a descendant of the German emigrant Nicholas Blankenbeckler who came over in 1717 and patented land June 14, 1726 on Robinson River. Jesse Blankenbeckler was born probably in Rye Valley of Smyth County Virginia prior to 1800, probably all his children born there. He married in Washington County, Virginia October 8, 1817 Rhoda Odel and migrated from Rye Valley about 1837 to land he bought and entered in Big Mocassin Valley, Scott County, Virginia adjoining the land of Greenberry Evans, who had previously entered land in the Valley near the present site of Snowflake Post Office. Here Calvin Blankenbeckler married Edith Evans on May 10, 1840, recorded in Scott County, Virginia. William Blankenbeckler and his father Jesse moved to Hawkins County, Tennessee prior to the war between the States and William served as a private in the Confederate Army. Although unable to trace Edith Evans' ancestry beyond her father Greenberry Evans, in the absence of proof, we think it can be safely said she was a descendant of the Revolutionary War veteran David Evans, through the lineage of his son Andrew who married Elizabeth Fain at Jonesboro, Tennessee in 1780. Greenberry Evans was married in Washington County, Virginia August 23, 1810 to Nancy Lilly and settled for a time in that county at Little Moccas'n Gap where Edith, their first child, was born, and later moved down Mocassin Valley into Scott County, and settled on a farm near, if not adjoining, the farm that Jesse Blankenbeckler at one time owned, and sold to Benjamin S. Fugate. The descendants of Greenberry Evans whose marriages are on record in Scott County Virginia are son, John, probably married January 18, 1845 to Elizabeth Blankenbeckler, and Rebecca who married February 4, 1830 William H. Nickels, and probably a son, Elijah who married Rhoda Green. John Anderson Blankenbeckler was born December 15, 1843 died June 5, 1915. He was a large, well-developed man with the strength of Sampson. Although a man who attended strictly to his own business, he could seldom be convinced of an error, and with his great strength to back him would fight to defend his views. Politically all his brothers were Republicans but he stood firm as a stone-wall with the Democratic party, was in sympathy with Jeff Davis and the Southern Confederacy, and joined the Southern Army in the War between the States. He was a brave soldier who feared nothing in or out of battle. In 1862 he was captured at Cumberland Gap and imprisoned at Camp Chase in Ohio, but was soon transferred from there to Fort Delaware and confined on a small island in the Chesapeake Bay until after the surrender. He was released April 5, 1865, and walked through the State of Virginia to his home at Nickelsville, arriving there some time in June. As he travelled through Eastern Virginia, he but little to eat except wild plums gathered along the way. While in service he sent his father a small sum of money with the request that he buy something he might need when he returned home, if he ever got

back. With the money his father bought a set of blacksmith tools and had them ready for him when he returned. He made blacksmithing his vocation and followed it half a century. John Anderson Blankenbeckler was married twice. Both marriages are on record in the Clerk's Office of Scott County, Virginia. His first marriage was January 10, 1866 to Nancy Green Addington (see VIII-7 for children). He married 2nd March 1881 to Amanda J. Cullup who was born December 1, 1857 died December 17, 1925, a daughter of Henry and Susan (Steffie) Culluy of Culpepper County, Virginia, by which marriage he had seven children.

S. mail from McConnell to Saratoga until these post-offices were discontinued for rural delivery from Nickelsville. For children, VIII-11.

Stallard Genealogy Vol. 1 No. 1, VI-No. 21. Dulcena (Sena) Stallard, dau. of Samuel and Jael Duncan Stallard md. James Green jr. and among other children had Mary who md. William Dingus, son of Philip and Nancy McConnell Dingus. Here we shall give the Dingus record. William Dingus (Dinges, Tinges, Dinius) came from Germany to Philadelphia, 1749, married twice, 1st wife's name is unknown, married 2nd Mary Kelker ca. 1770. William Dingus had by 1st wife children, names not known, and children by Mary Kelker, viz. Catheryne Dingus b. 9-21-1772 md. Jacob Endress, Philip Dingus b. 12-10-1774 md. Nancy McConnell 1799 in Dauphin Co. Penn.; Elizabeth b. 8-7-1877 md. Jacob Werner; Henry Dingus, no further record.

County of Lancaster, Penn. June 8th, 1785 Mary Dingus and Anthony Kelker appointed administrators of William Dingus' estate, late of Heidelberg Tws. Lancaster Co. Penn. brought into the court an account of their administration as follows: 11 lbs. in specie money and 3,248 lbs. in currency, and Anthony Kelker further produced the sum of 6960 pounds in loan office certificates being part of the estate. The court ordered the above money to be distributed among the widow and children. At the same session of court the court appoints Henry Shell as guardian of Henry Dingus, above 14 years of age; further the court appoints Michael Ley guardian of Philip Dingus under 14 years of age; court appoints Henry Schafer guardian of Catheryne and Elizabeth Dingus, both under 14 years of age.

This William Dingus had brothers and sisters as is shown in the settlement of Jacob Dingus' estate, Lebanon, Penn. 1810, which follows: "The petition of John Endress who md. Catheryne Dingus, daughter of Wm. and Mary Kelker Dingus and the eldest brother of Jacob Dingus. States that Jacob Dingus died without issue but had collateral heirs and a full brother to-wit: Elizabeth Dingus md. Jacob Werner, Catheryne Dingus md. John Endress, Philip Dingus and Henry Dingus, the children of Jacob's eldest brother, John Dingus, second brother of the deceased, also Geo. Peter, Philip, Catheryne and Elizabeth Trump, children of Barbara Trump, daughter of Barbara Ley, a sister of the intestate. Andreas Ley and daughter who md. John Weirich, late daughter of Ann who md. Ley was another sister of the intestate."

The intestate died in possession of a plantation of 242 acres on the "Great Western Road" near Lebanon, value \$200.00 per acre, and another tract of about 8 acres. Your petitioner prays your honor to award an inquest to make partition of Jacob Dingus's estate. Dated May 1, 1810.

John and Catheryne Dingus Endress were given the small tract of land under the assignment of John Dingus, brother to the deceased. The 242 acre farm was awarded to Jacob Dingus June 6, 1766. The distribution of Jacob Dingus' estate follows, dated 7-30-1810: Mary Dingus, widow of William Dingus, holds mortgage on 242 acres in amount of \$10,080.00 which lien was created by a decree of the Orphan's Court, Dauphin Co. 9-19-1787 in favor of Mary Dingus and this amount is to be deducted from the Jacob Dingus' estate. The balance of estate were given as follows: John Endress in the right of John Dingus, \$3,320.00; John and Catheryne Dingus Endress, \$830.00; Catheryne, one of the children of William Dingus; Henry Dingus, \$830.00; Philip Dingus, \$830.00; Peter Gloniger in the right of Andreas Ley and his wife, John Weirich and his wife, \$3,323.00; Jacob Werner and his wife Elizabeth Dingus, daughter of William Dingus, \$830.00.

John and Catheryne Dingus Endress rejected this distribution on account of no provision being made for Barbara Dingus who married George Trump and further no provision for Adam Dingus, a half-brother of the deceased.

Philip Dingus married Nancy McConnell, Dauphin Co. Penn. 1799. Nancy was daughter of George and Reginia McConnell. George McConnell's will dated 5-8-1793, Dauphin Co. Penn. in which these children are mentioned, viz: John, George, Adam and Nancy—Adam and Nancy are minors. Witnesses to will were John Gloniger and J. Rohrer; administrators sons, John and George II. On October 2, 1802 Philip Dingus had court issue a citation for John and George II McConnell to render an accounting of George McConnell Sr.'s estate. George McConnell II md. Susannah Snavely, and Philip Dingus md. Nancy McConnell, George II's sister, and they came to Russell Co. Va. 1803. These two families' descendants married into the Stallard family of Scott and Russell Cos. Va. Philip Dingus moved from Russell Co. to near Wood, Va. where he and his wife Nancy died and were buried in the Dingus Cemetery. George and Susanna McConnell moved from Glade Hollow Fort, Russell Co. Va. to Glade Hollow, Scott Co. Va. about 1820.

From the old Philip Dingus Bible in German gives these children: Thomas McConnell b. 1-6-1797, was born before Nancy married Philip Dingus, was not his son, but supposed to be a Dempsey, and Thomas is not mentioned in Philip Dingus' will 1831. (1) John Dingus b. 6-23-1800 md. 1st Nancy Compton 8-12-1825 (see Vol. V No. 3 Comptonology for descendants). After death of Nancy, John md. Jail Stallard Powers 8-27-1847 and issue: (a) Nancy md. William Daugherty and their issue: Nathan, never married; John

md. Sallie McClellan and have issue; Carson md. Verdie Addington; Lucy Jane md. W. Patton Blankenler; Hanna md. E. W. McConnel; Laura md. Jas. E. Bevins; Susan md. Creed Fraley; W. Logan md. Rhoda McConnell, moved to Colorado, have issue; Wilson md. Lillie Smith, have issue; Nannie md. Leslie Colgin, and Pluma md. Ernest Ramey. (b) Lucy Dingus md. Elbert Meade and issue: Mary md. John Moore, grandson of Thomas and Frances Stallard Moore; Jacob md. Ethel Culbertson, gt-granddaughter of William and Mary Green Dingus; Elbert jr. died unmarried. (c) Dr. George md. Carrico and had son, Dr. Kinley Dingus who married and lives in Oklahoma.

(2) Catheryne Dingus b. 1-29-1802, never married. (3) Henry Dingus b. 8-21-1803 md. Nancy Dollarhide 4-13-1828, moved to Missouri and had issue, Nancy died and he md. 2nd and had issue. (4) William Dingus b. 3-27-1805 md. Mary Green 4-14-1831, daughter of James and Dulcinea (Sena) Stallard Green and issue: (a) Jane md. William Culbertson 1856 and issue: Larue md. Chas. Broadwater, grandson of Thomas and Frances Stallard Moore and issue: Robert B. md. Mary Price and had issue; Earl B. md. Marie Carter, no issue; Janie md. Robert McConnell, gt.-grandson of George III and Polly Compton McConnell; Emily Culbertson md. Samuel McConnell, no issue; George Culbertson md. Flora Bell Daugherty and had a large family; William Scott Culbertson b. 8-21-1864 md. Mollie Lawson and issue: Maud, Rhea, Mack, Thos. B. md. Mamie Kennedy, left no issue; Nannie Culbertson b. 1871 md. Chas. C. Palmer and issue: Hoke, Fay, Don, Larue, Elsie, Chas., C. J. and Gene; Jephtha b. 1871 md. Elizabeth Barrett; Effie b. 3-7-1877 md. Robt. L. McConnell, issue: Jephtha, Nannie Lois, Maxwell Tate, Grady Allen.

(b) James Dingus md. Halbert in Ky. and had issue. (c) David md. Halbert in Ky. (d) Samuel Dingus md. Flanary and moved to Ky. (e) Wesley md. Nancy Flanary in Kentucky. (f) Henry Dingus md. Ellen Moore, Scott Co. Va., moved to Comanche, Texas, left many children. (g) Susan Dingus b. 1839 md. Berry Compton 1858 and lived in Scott Co. Va. (See Comptonology Vol. V, No. 3 for complete list of descendants). (h) Philip Dingus md. Mary Banner and issue: Chas. md. Mozella Cox and have son, Philip; William md. Wilson, Comanche, Texas, no issue, lives at Lubbock, Texas; Nannie md. Patrick Hagan jr., lives Bristol, Tenn. and have issue: Lee R. educated in the public schools, A. B. from Milligan College, M. A. Ph. D. University of Va., Ph. D. Berlin University, professor in Richmond College, dean of Transylvania University for 25 years where he died, considered to be one of the ripest scholars in America, married Elizabeth Blackburn, Boston, and issue: Daughter, Elizabeth; Mozella Dingus married Dr. Wm. R. Culbertson, son of Joe and Mary McConnell Culbertson, lives at Coeburn and have issue: Bascon married and lives at Morristown, Tenn., have issue; Irving married in Montana, no issue; Otto married and have issue, lives at Dungannon, Va. (i) Isabelle md. Henry Dean and left issue, a child died in infancy.

(5) Susannah Dingus b. 3-27-1807 md. David Duncan, lived on Stock Creek, Scott Co. Va., left issue. (6) Sara or called Betsy b. 3-27-1809 md. Geo. W. Thompson, 11-12-1848, lived in Russell Co. Va., left no issue.

(7) George Dingus b. 2-11-1811 md. Margaret Addington 4-29-1831 and her grandfather was Samuel Stallard, and her mother Elizabeth Stallard, daughter of Rawley and Elizabeth Hutchinson Stallard and issue: Mary b. 3-37-1832 md. Thos. Hilton, and he went to California in 1849 and his wife's uncle William Dingus loaned him \$200.00 to make the trip on the condition that if he returned he would pay William Dingus \$400.00 and the money was paid. (b) Henry W. b. 8-8-1833 md. Nancy Culbertson, sister of William who md.

Jane Dingus, Henry W. taught school in Virginia, Ky. and Mo. and also farmed. In Missouri he arose early one morning as his habit, fed his horses and when Nancy had breakfast ready she called but Henry was not to be found, and no record or trace was ever heard of him afterwards. They had these children: Patrick, John, LaFayette, Henry jr., Hopkins, Hester, Stephen and Walker. (c) Ann b. 10-15-1835 md. David J. Hilton, another "forty-niner," and William Dingus loaned him the money to make the trip on same condition as he did his brother, Thomas, and he returned and paid him the \$400.00. (d) Nancy b. 12-25-1837 md. Wm. Elam and issue: Margarey d. young; G. Milton Elam, noted educator of the South md. Rebecca Bond, no issue; Mary md. Dr. R. A. Smith, grandson of Thomas and Frances Stallard Moore; Melvin md. Rosa Davenport; Margaret md. W. B. Culbertson in Ky.; Dr. K. P. md. Susan Frazier, 2nd Maud Bird; Nathan md. Sara Smith; Laura md. Samuel Nickels; Jas. md. Mollie Eversole; Nannie md. E. C. Grear; Emma md. J. W. Powers; Hettie md. J. F. Hartsock; Chas. B. md. Winnie Puckett.

(e) Sara b. 7-16-1840 md. Geo. H. Addington and issue: A. J. moved to Texas; Mary md. Robt. Lawson; Henry md. Nannie Meade; Martha md. Harve Sulpridge; Chas. md. Drucilla Hale; Geo. md. Marie Stallard; John md. Louisa Boatright, and William md. Alwida Green.

(8) Lucy Dingus b. 12-15-18(?) here the Bible record is blurred, md. Wm. Casteel 1-5-1832 and lived in Russell Co. Va. and had issue. (9) Samuel b. (not given) md. Mahalla Wells, moved to Lee Co. Va., left no issue. (10) Nancy b. (date not given) md. Calvin Flanary, lived near Wood, Va. and left issue.

Sometime ago I made a trip to Pennsylvania and examined many of the old records of Dauphin Co. Penn. and above is my partial findings. (C. V. C.)

The marriage records, Gate City, Va. gives the marriage of these children of Thomas and Frances Stallard Moore: Celia Moore md. Mark Smith, 1836; Susanna Moore md. Daniel Ramey 1842; Melvina Moore md. Chas. K. Broadwater 3-24-1853; Frances Moore md. Dr. John R. Carter 12-12-1853; Hugh Moore md. Melissa Cox; Hugh b. 6-28-1838, d. 11-13-1889; Col. John Moore md. Charles and Mary Gray Kilgore; Mary Ann married Shadrack Greear.

During the life time of the noted educator Dr. L. R. Dingus he sent me (C. V. Compton) William F. Stallard's notes on the Stallard family (Wm. F. was son of James and Elizabeth McConnell Stallard) from which I copy the following: Peter Stallard, b. 1797 son of Rawley and Elizabeth Hutchinson Stallard, md. Luemma Easterling; (4) Dion-esius md. Mary Carter; (5) Marab md. David Csvorne; (6) Jasper M. md. Pop Davis; (7) Jael b. 1834, md. Edward (Ned) Culbertson; (8) Lucy md. John Rhiner; (6) Daniel md. name unknown; (10) Martin md. Elizabeth Addington; (11) Virginia md. Creed Palmer.

Rawley D. Stallard son of Rawley and Elizabeth Stallard b. 1804, md. Mary Foster and issue: (1) Jacob md. Foster; (2) John md. Regina Denison; (3) Jane md. Henderson Riggs; (4) David md. 1st Susanna Baker, md. second daughter of Henry Smith; (5) Nancy md. 1st Lewis, 2nd Webb; (6) Elizabeth md. Jackson Dotson; (7) Lucy md. 1st Webb, 2nd Elam.

Martha, daughter of Rawley and Elizabeth Stallard, b. 1809 md. Samuel Stallard and issue (1) Martha, died young, only child.

Elizabeth, daughter of Rawley and Elizabeth Stallard, b. 1813 md. Wm. Addington and issue: (1) Charles, never married; (2) Nancy md. Anderson Blankenbeckler; (3) Jane md. Marion Porter; (4) Huda md. Henry Blakenbeckler; (5) William md. Porter; (6) James md. Porter; (7) Elizabeth md. Wm. C. Marshall; (8) Joshua md. Hartsock, moved to Okla; (9) Joseph md. Alley; (10) Maggie md. Abigal Alley; (11) Rev. John D. md. moved to California.

Duncan Stallard son of Rawley and Elizabeth Stallard b. 1814 md. Elizabeth Addington and issue: (1) Anderson md. John Riggs; (2) Jackson md. Hillman; (3) Jane md. Hubbard; (4) Margaret md. Powers; (5) Rawley md. but do not now recall name. (William F. said they had two other children but failed to recall names.)

Green Stallard b. 1817 son of Rawley and Elizabeth Stallard, md. Elizabeth Cox, married 2nd Bessie Davis; he went to Kentucky during the Civil War. Another son of Rawley and Elizabeth was Martin who left Scott County, Va. in 1862, do not know where he went.

Rawley's son Samuel moved to Pocahontas, Bond Co. Ill. and know little of them.

William F. Stallard was an unusual person, very honorable in all dealings, strictly temperate in all food and drinks, and what he heard or saw he never forgot, possibly had the richest storehouse of knowledge when he died in 1923 at 89 years of age and the only other person I have ever seen with only one ear was Charles McConnel, son of Jeremiah and Alwida Greear McConnell.
